Heritage Site and Historic Cemetery Designations are made by consensus of the Hudson River Valley National Heritage Area Management Committee. The Committee's decisions are guided by the following criteria:

Both **Heritage Sites and Historic Cemeteries** meet all the following criteria:

- Be relevant to at least one of the themes of the Heritage Area:
 - Freedom and Dignity
 - Nature and Culture
 - Corridor of Commerce
- Be owned and operated by a local, state or federal government or a not-for-profit organization
- Offer visitors an incomparable cultural or historical Hudson River Heritage experience

In addition, designated **Heritage Sites** must meet the following criteria:

- Absolutely Must See and Highly Recommended category sites are open to the public at least 4 days/week, 6 months/year (see designated heritage site categories on next page)
- Special Interest category sites are open to the public at least 75 days a year
- Contain interpretive components, is accessible, has a trained staff, and has restroom facilities.

In addition, designated **Cemeteries** must meet the following criteria:

- A “cemetery” is defined as a secure burial place of human remains. Graveyards (burial sites located adjacent to houses of worship) are included under this definition. Collections or scatterings of ashes, unless associated with an established cemetery, do not constitute a cemetery for purposes of this designation
- Open to the public at least 4 days a week, 6 months a year
- Derives its primary significance from any of:
 - Graves of persons of transcendent importance
 - Age of the burials (cemetery must be at least 50 years old)
 - Distinctive landscape, design, or funerary art features
 - Association with historic events

Designated Heritage Site Categories:

“Absolutely Must See”: Limited to ~15 properties

- Attendance: 25,000 or more visitors per year
- Significance: National
- Staff: Full time staff
- Amenities: Full complement of tourism support services
- Hours: At least 4 days a week, 6 months a year

“Highly Recommended”: Limited to ~15 properties

- Attendance: 15,000 or more visitors per year
- Significance: State
- Staff: At least two professional full-time staff members
- Amenities: Basic visitor amenities
- Hours: At least 4 days a week, 6 months a year

“Special Interest”: No limit to number

- Attendance: 5,000 or more visitors per year
- Significance: Regional
- Staff: At least one professional full-time staff member
- Amenities: Basic visitor amenities
- Hours: At least 75 days per year
